Rodden Nature Reserve Open Day

TUESDAY 11TH

2 SESSIONS RODDEN NATURE RESERVE FREE

Join a 2-hour guided walk with conservationist George Linklater. Learn about the incredible flora and fauna we have in Frome. Plus expert tips for successful wildlife spotting, including the best sites to see birds here for the breeding season.

We'll also share how the area acts as a nature corridor and a vital flood defence for Frome town centre, and how it's maintained and protected for the community and the wildlife.

Tiny Forest Citizen Science Workshop

My Garden of a Thousand Bees 🕷

SUNDAY 16TH * 4 - 6PM FROME TOWN HALL FREE

This wonderful film follows acclaimed wildlife filmmaker Martin Dohrn as he records all the bee species in his tiny urban garden in Bristol. Filming with one-of-a-kind lenses forged at his kitchen table, he catalogues more than 60 species. He eventually gets so close to the bees he can identify individuals by sight, documenting life at their level as we have never seen it before.

After the film, Meadow In My Garden CIC will lead a Q&A to answer your questions about bees and wildlife-friendly planting, and show you how to make a bee hotel.





5 actions for the planet

Small changes can make a big difference over time. Take a look at these 5 simple actions based on this year's GBGW programme and choose one to start with. They'll benefit your health or your wallet too!

You don't have to do these things alone. Each action has a local group or project that can help you get started, stay motivated, and meet people.

Learn some basic sewing skills to repair and repurpose clothes, and swap or buy pre-loved clothes instead of buying new.

Download the iNaturalist app to learn more about the plants and animals around you. It will help you feel more connected to nature and help wildlife monitoring and conservation efforts. Win-win!
