#### Summary

This report is an overview of the Events element of the work of the Marketing and Communications team - it looks at the events, the objectives that they are designed to meet and achieve and also takes a look forward at the planning for the next tranche of events as we head into the final quarter of the year.

### General

The Marketing and Communications team have been promoting and delivering a number of projects, events, and initiatives designed to engage the town, attract visitors, and promote both the town and the work of Frome Town Council. Following discussions, this paper outlines upcoming events and begins to inform plans as we look ahead to the next financial year.

Our standard paragraph for framing this area of work is as follows: Events and meetings are an effective way to engage with the town; they bring people together to share, learn, celebrate, and feel supported and heard. For that reason, events are the bedrock of our work, whether we are hosting our own or supporting and promoting other events. At the outset, we establish the objectives that the event seeks to deliver, which inform the choices we make, how we organise the event, and how we gauge its success afterwards. Wherever possible, we work with community partners to ensure a greater number of events overall, tap into the talents of our community to offer a more diverse range of activities, and pool resources by lending our support in promoting and organising others' events. We provide spaces, collaborate with others, and promote events and the visitor economy to foster community cohesion, vibrancy, and prosperity.

As previously acknowledged, we support other town events by providing access to parks and open spaces. Our role is to ensure that the relevant paperwork is in place and to support the smooth running of these events. When working with others, decisions about the level of support are made on a case-by-case basis.

#### The Events Advisory Group

Following a discussion at the last Oversight meeting, the Events Advisory Group no longer meets, and discussions and decisions regarding events are now brought to this committee.

#### Looking Forward

We work across the team to shape events that help deliver our strategy, meet our objectives, and create high-quality experiences for the benefit of the community. The next tranche of

## A Drone Event

We are in continuing conversations with Celestial about how we might work with them and their partners to bring a drone event back to Frome this year. Their focus is on consolidating their business model this year and working with ticketing partners on predominantly stadium shows. As a result, we are unable to hold an event this year without incurring their community event rate of between  $\pounds_{30,000}$ — $\pounds_{40,000}$ , with production costs on top of that. This contrasts with their commercial rate of  $\pounds_{75,000}$  and upwards. However, they remain committed to working with us in the future under the charity model we have developed together with our community as their home crowd. So, watch this space for plans for next year.

# Promoting and Supporting Others

We also play a significant role in promotion and information sharing. Examples include listing events on the well-used Discover Frome website, which receives around 50,000 views per month, using our network of community noticeboards, and publicising events through our social media channels and the press.

Similarly, the Marketing and Communications team supports events organised and delivered by the wider FTC team. This support usually includes branding, ticketing, PR, creating marketing collateral such as posters and materials, and digital assets, as well as a package of social media support. Examples of recurring events that fall within this scope include the energy advice drop-ins and roadshows, retrofit activities, Let's Talk sessions, the Wild Bunch meetings, and the Play Pod on Tour sessions. Our capacity is often tested, so any additional capacity will be used to support these and other annual town events. They can be found here in our events table: <u>Annual Events</u>.

## Conclusion

We continue to explore how we can support, attract, and create partnerships to bring new events to our town centre while supporting existing events in creative ways. This year, our focus is on finding a solution to ensure the continuation of the markets and exploring how we can build and improve them. This will be scrutinised in the context of the wider devolution package. There remains flexibility in the calendar and budget to allow us to develop other opportunities as they arise.

This approach will also enable us to dedicate more time and resources to other town and community events as they emerge and to the broader promotion of events in Frome. There are additional ideas still under consideration, such as a folk festival, a jazz festival, an Americana festival, and a frost fair. We will continue to work with the community as these and other opportunities arise and will bring more concrete and developed plans back for oversight.

#### Recommendations

Events are a great engagement tool and bring people together around a common theme for learning, shared experience and can have community value. The recommendations are:

- 1. Note the up-coming events up until the end of this financial year
- 2. Agree the programme of events as set out in the table above for the up coming year
- 3. Agree to the Marketing and Communications team to continue to work with event organisers to support new events into the town centre as they arise.
